INTRODUCTION TO TRIPLETS AND THE SWING RHYTHM


Eighth note triplets are a group of three eighth notes contained in a quarter note. In the previous exercises, 2 eighth notes equal a quarter note. However with eighth note triplets, three eighth notes equal a quarter note. When we move on to our first jazz song that uses swing ("So What" by Miles Davis) We will be using this swing rhythm to play eighth notes, rather than regular straight eighth notes. Let's start with the basic quarter note, then we'll move to triplets



now let's work on the triplet, use the words above to count the triplet, and have your instructor count them with you.



Let's combine some quarter notes and triplets to help get a better feel for the triplet rhythm.

Now that you have a feel for the triplet rhythm, let's introduce the swing rhythm. The swing rhythm is based off of the triplet. Rather than playing eighth notes straight, the eighth notes are played "swung" where the 1st eighth note is the first note of the triplet, and the last eighth note is the last note of the triplet or "UH." First let's demonstrate straight eighth notes and count out loud.



Now go back to the last page and count the triplets again (1 is uh, 2 is uh, 3 is uh, 4 is uh) After that do the next exercise and count aloud with your instructor. Notice that the second note of the triplet "IS" is a rest or silent.



Now let's take "IS" out and count just using the number and "UH"



Congratulations, you've now learned the basic swing rhythm. When a song is indicated that it should be swung, rather than writing out the full triplet, the composer will only write 2 eighth notes, and the performer is expected to know that that means to play them with a triplet feel. To get a feel for this, first we are going to try some rhythms containing the full triplet. After that we will simply use eighth notes to indicate the swing rhythm

Now we are just going to use regular eighth notes to indicate the swing rhythm. Remember it is assumed that the performer knows the eighth notes should be swung based off the triplet and not just played as a straight eighth note











Now that you have a basic feel for the swing rhythm, let's go over a few word patterns that will help you internalize the beat




